

Let Us Be Attentive:

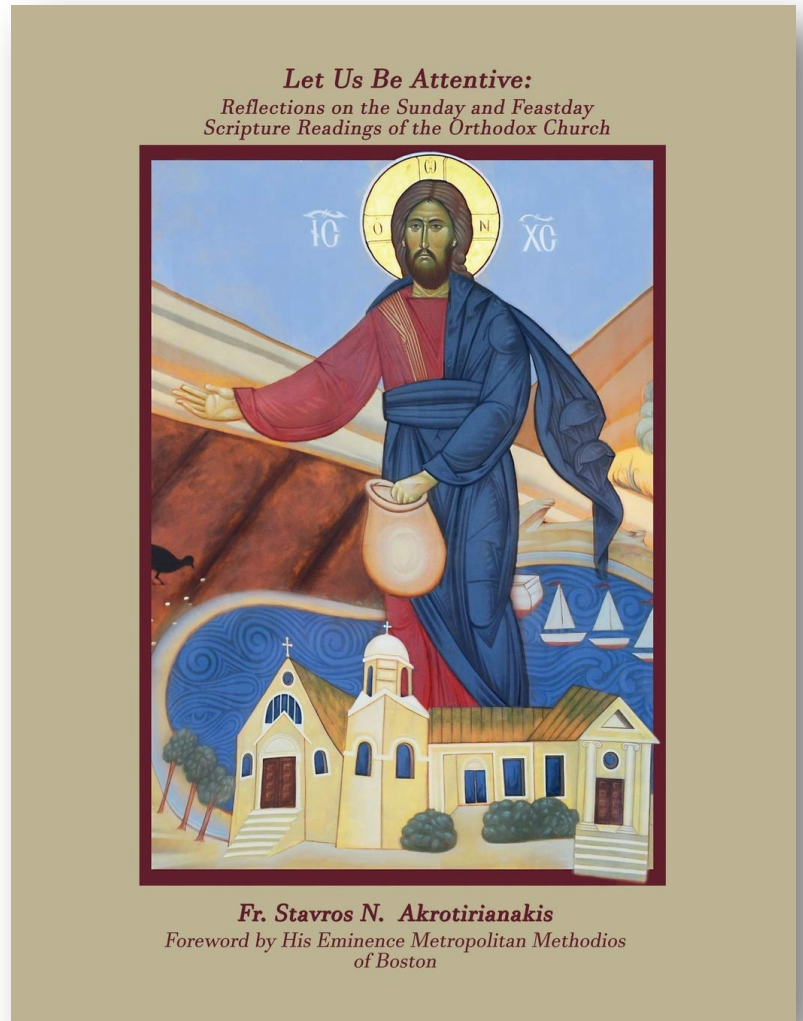
Reflections on the Sunday and Feastday Scripture Readings of the Orthodox Church
